#### The Challenge

Letham FC was founded in 1960 and over the years has played a prominent role in the development of youth football within Perth, growing as a club to encompass 22 teams of varying ages and for both boys and girls.

Letham is now one of the biggest clubs in the east of Scotland and is pioneering in the fact that it is the first community club in Perth with a catchment area not only including Letham but also the neighbouring estates of Burghmuir, Oakbank, Western Edge, Tulloch, Hillyland and the surrounding areas.

Based at 7 Acres, Perth, this ambitious club has 7 female teams for Season 2017, offering football for women from U9s through to playing in Division Two of the Scottish Womens Football League.

#### The Measures

The Balfour Beatty team at the Perth Transport Futures Project was approached to see if they could provide any support for Letham’s U11 girl’s team to assist them in their goal of providing tracksuits for all the members of the team.

#### The Results

The Perth Transport Futures construction team donated £600 to the U11’s team at Letham GWFC which allowed them to buy new tracksuits for training and match days. Project Manager, Ken Brown, attended the club to hand over the new tracksuits to the team who were delighted with their new kit.
